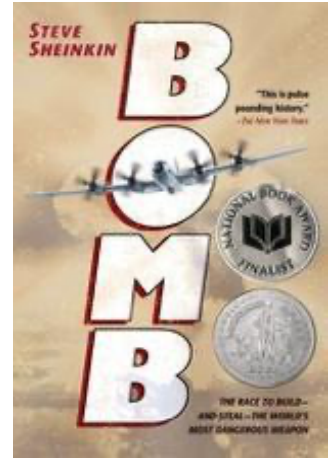


Camp 2: July 22 - 26 (target grades 7 - 11)

It changed the world forever -- Bomb (Newbury Honor Book)

In late 1938, German physicist Otto Hahn discovered that energy is released when an atom is split. So began a secret race between Nazi Germany, the Soviet Union and the United States to build the first atomic bomb.

*The first nation to build the bomb would win World War II - and reshape the world. Before an American-led team of scientists built the first bombs that ended the war in 1945, Allied soldiers died - without knowing why - sabotaging the Nazi program, and spies stole secrets that helped the Soviets to build their own bomb. **BOMB** describes dramatically how the bomb was built, how and why it was used - and how it changed the world forever.*

Online Summer Camp

Students will enhance comprehension and writing skills as they:

- analyze a few chapters of a novel daily
- respond to questions in full sentences
- cite evidence to support the answers
- improve grammar and response structure
- learn new vocabulary words from the novel
- study symbols authors use; what do they mean?
- learn about the historical era of the book
- identify and explain the theme of the novel

The camp is taught by Mr. Keery, a certified teacher and professional author.

Each day, students will:

- attend a Zoom class from 9:00 AM to 11:30 AM
- read, listen to, and discuss parts of the novel together
- complete a written comprehension activity
- submit a writing assignment connected to the novel
- review the previous day's assignment
- complete approximately 30 minutes of homework independently to be submitted daily for feedback
