

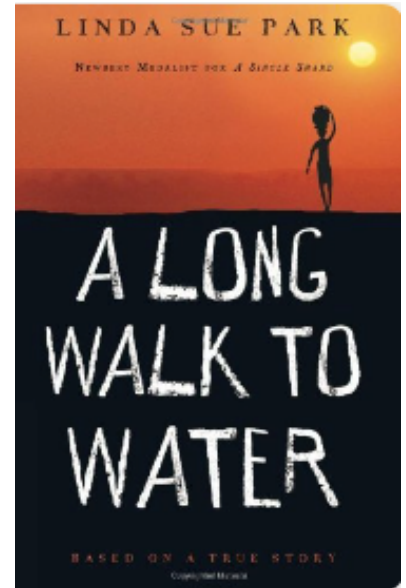
Camp 3: Aug. 12-16 (target grades 4-7)

Survival, perseverance, and strength – A Long Walk to Water
(Newbery Award-Winning Author)

A Long Walk to Water alternates between two storylines about a young Sudanese girl, Nya, and an eleven-year-old Sudanese boy, Salva.

Nya fetches water from a pond two hours' walk from her home; she makes two trips to the pond daily.

Based on a true story, Salva's tale is harrowing. During a normal day in 1985, war arrives in his village, and he's forced to run into the bush as gunshots are fired. He has no idea where he's going; he only knows he must seek safety as far away from home as possible. Enduring every hardship, from loneliness to attacks by armed rebels, Salva is a survivor, and his story goes on to intersect with Nya's in an astounding and moving way.

Online Summer Camp

Students will enhance comprehension and writing skills as they:

- analyze a few chapters of a novel daily
- respond to questions in full sentences
- cite evidence to support the answers
- improve grammar and response structure
- learn new vocabulary words from the novel
- study symbols authors use; what do they mean?
- learn about the historical era of the book
- identify and explain the theme of the novel

The camp is taught by Ms. Tomines, a certified elementary and high school English teacher.

Each day, students will:

- attend a Zoom class from 9:00 AM to 11:30 AM
- read, listen to, and discuss parts of the novel together
- complete a written comprehension activity
- submit a writing assignment connected to the novel
- review the previous day's assignment
- complete approximately 30 minutes of homework independently to be submitted daily for feedback
